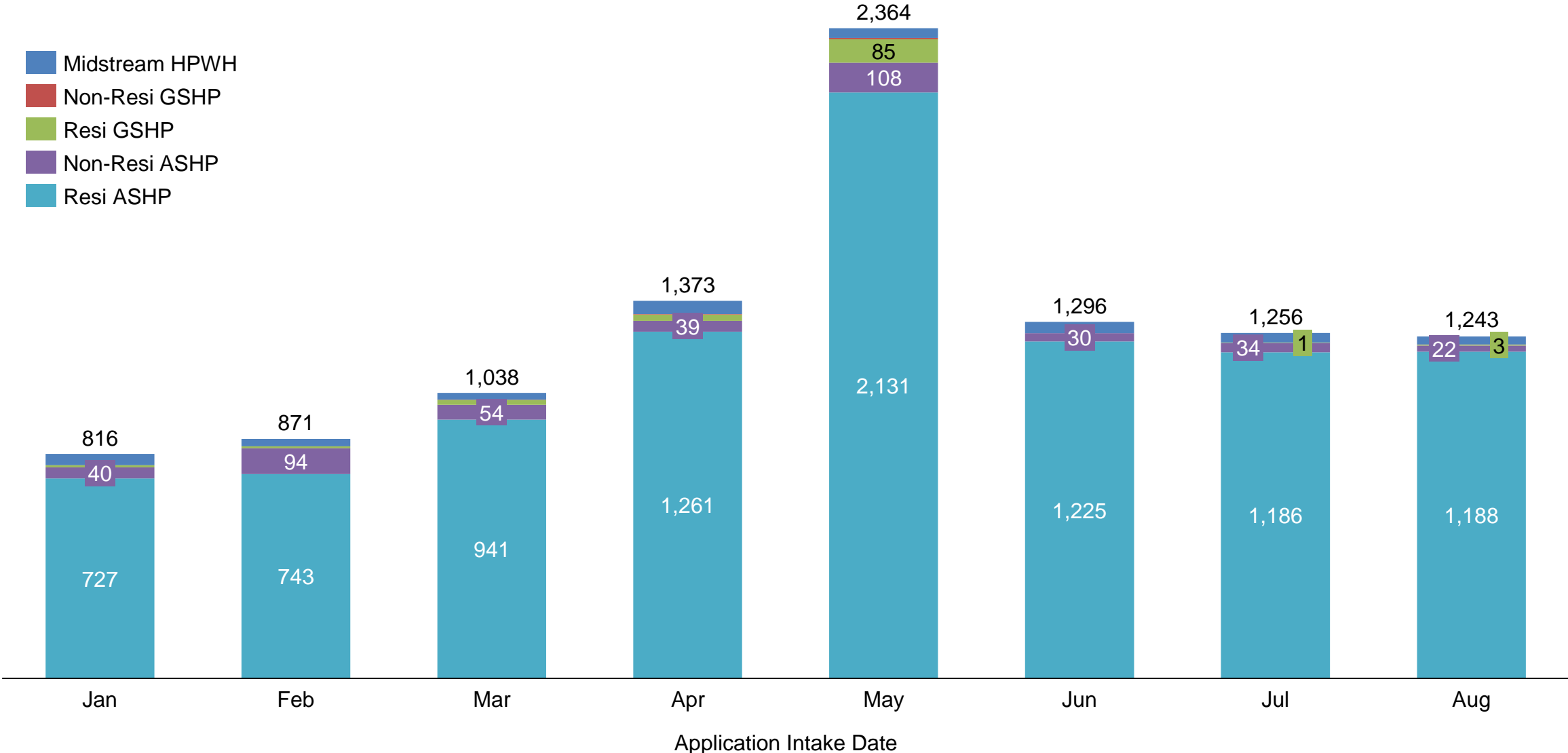

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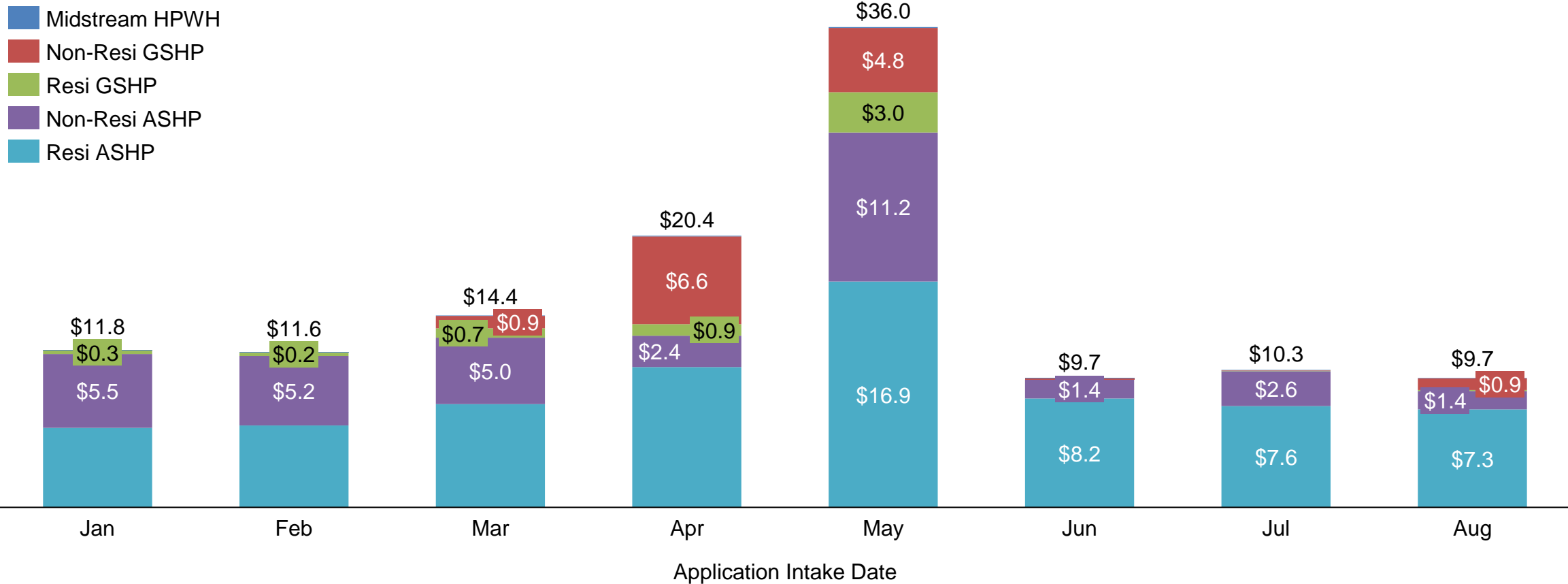
Program Intake – 2024 Application Count

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Clean Heat Program Manual Updates

Key changes are summarized below, and all changes are included in a Summary of Changes table at the beginning of the Program Manual.

- Soundview bonus incentives are set to expire on December 31, 2024. Projects must be installed by October 1, 2024, to be eligible for the Soundview bonus incentives.
- New prescriptive incentive offerings for Ground Source Heat Pump (GSHP) projects in existing and new construction Multifamily buildings.
- As part of the electric service review process, a project case must be submitted and a Master Case ID (MCID) must be returned with a signed Preliminary Incentive Offer Letter for Multifamily, Small Biz, and Non-Residential GSHP projects.
- Effective October 15, 2024, Residential Contractors must provide the licensed plumber's name and license number on the project application in the Online Intake Tool ("OIT").
- Revised inspections and disciplinary processes for all contractors.

New incentive offering: Prescriptive GSHP rates

New prescriptive incentive offerings for Ground Source Heat Pump (GSHP) projects in existing and new construction Multifamily buildings.

Category	Description	New Construction (Per Apartment)	Existing Buildings (Per Apartment)
3a	Multifamily Space Heating Applications	\$2,000	\$5,000
6a	Prescriptive Hot Water Heating Applications	\$1,000	\$1,000

Incentives will be capped at \$1 million per project or 50% of project costs, whichever is lower

Demonstration on Submitting Cases for Electric Service Rulings

Case Filing on Project Center

- To obtain an MCID number, contractors need to file a case on Project Center
 - Project Center can be used across all devices and browsers
- How to file a case on Project Center:
 - [Register](http://www.coned.com/es) at www.coned.com/es
 - Emails must be registered in Project Center to create or view cases
 - Case contacts will receive an *email* with the MCID number
- Only **primary customer** or **primary contractor** can:
 - Add or make changes to contacts
 - Make appointments
 - Accept/ Decline cost estimates

Case Registration Process

- Case is created in Project Center
 - Electric: Add Load to Existing Service
- Reviewed by Energy Service Personnel to ensure all required documentation has been submitted
- Engineering review if applicable
- Service determination:
 - Service adequate: no Con Ed work, may require customer work
 - Service not adequate: Con Edison work required, may require customer work
- Work Commences: time frame depends on scope
- Work Completed: Electric service is closed out

Revised Disciplinary Process

- Effective October 15, 2024, the Con Edison Clean Heat Program is implementing a revised disciplinary process for all participating contractors
- The revised disciplinary process is available in Section 6 of the [Con Edison Clean Heat Program Manual](#)
- The new process outlines the disciplinary actions, required remediation steps, and potential risks associated with failing to address issues promptly
- Con Edison will provide informational webinars on September 26 and October 10 to familiarize residential contractors with our updated disciplinary process
- We will share more information about how the revised disciplinary process will apply to non-residential sectors in the coming weeks

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ASHP Residential Contractor Allocations

- Contractors received Q4 2024 allocations on Friday, September 20, 2024.
- Contractors may only submit applications for incentives within their allocated incentive budget.
- Contractors are encouraged to reach out to their account manager to request additional funding for projects beyond their allocation prior to installation.
- Contractors who sell projects above their allocation risk those projects being ineligible for incentives or temporarily losing access to submit new applications.
