

Safety Message – COVID-19

- > We are in a winter surge in COVID-19 cases in New York state, driven by the rapid spread of the Omicron variant
- > We want to remind all Participating Contractors to continue to follow <u>New York State Health</u> <u>Department</u> and <u>CDC</u> guidelines and regulations in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19
- > We encourage Participating Contractors to take extra precaution and use good judgement particularly when visiting customer homes and sites – in order to protect yourself and our customers, including:
 - Maintaining social distancing
 - Wearing your face covering
 - Frequent hand washing and following good hygiene practices

New 2022 required training – Cold Climate ASHP Sizing and Design

- > Effective January 1, 2022, in addition to all other enrollment requirements, all <u>new</u> ASHP installers seeking to become a NYS Clean Heat Program Participating Contractor must <u>also</u> provide documentation that they've completed an ASHP manufacturer-sponsored Cold Climate ASHP Sizing and Design Training requirement
 - NYS Clean Heat also strongly urges all participating contractors who enrolled prior to January 1, 2022 to take advantage of this training opportunity
- > NYSERDA developed a <u>course curriculum</u> guide and <u>training presentation content</u> and introduced it to ASHP manufacturers in April, with the understanding that this training would be delivered by these manufacturers through their existing training channels
 - Utilizing the course curriculum guide, manufacturers had the option to create a standalone module, or embed into a broader training
 - Manufacturers could use an off-the-shelf, brand agnostic training available to use outright, or adapt from
 - With no current listing of these training offerings available, contractors are encouraged to reach out to their distributor or manufacturer representative for details on the availability of trainings


- > Previous sprint items completed in 2021
 - Filtering on dashboard, exporting data, adjusting columns, premise info in emails, deploy text messages, coordination of messaging with OIT changes, HPWH OIT alternatives, status glossary, tips on fields, aging of current status
- > First three 1/10/2022 items started testing together, but have had some issues reset to early next week (1/18, day after holiday)
- Last item (add total project aging) led to questions back from IT team with regards to how to handle projects that are completed don't want them to keep aging but difficult to freeze the number, so we are looking to set timing to 0 if project is completed and paid out. Firming up new ETA with IT team

- > Also focusing right now on the "OIT identical" tasks currently on harmonizing the order of fields, identified as the key issue, dates TBD but no later than 5/1

ICF Process Cycle Times for Completed Projects



- Reported by Quarter previously, now by month
- Processing times go up in the short run due to focus on processing older projects, then come down
- November-December clean-up focusing on Con Edison's older projects
 - Also focused on resolving older projects for other utilities in Nov-Dec

Clarifications regarding March 1, 2022 residential incentive changes

We received questions from several participants in last month's webinar asking why incentives are changing on March 1, 2022, and would like to provide the following clarifications:

- The Clean Heat program saw impressively rapid growth in Central Hudson, Con Edison, and Orange & Rockland service territories in 2021. For Central Hudson and Con Edison, incentive expenditures have significantly exceeded their 2021 utility budgets and are approaching the total budgets for the entire program term (through 2025). The incentive changes were made to manage the utilities' remaining authorized Clean Heat program budgets.
- The utilities did not come to the decision to decrease incentives lightly. We are committed to ensuring the long-term success of the Clean Heat program by managing each utility's budget as prescribed by New York State's New Efficiency: New York Order, which supports all customer segments and applicable technology categories.
- The goal of the Category 2 ASHP incentive adders for integrated controls and decommissioning is to incentivize full-load systems that are both installed and used for heating, in accordance with statewide policies. The utilities encourage contractors to continue to build business models around selling and installing systems used as the building's primary or only heating source, and to take advantage of the Category 2 ASHP adders where applicable.

We currently have 4 full load Clean Heat projects in our pipeline that have already been contracted. **Due** to the current supply chain situation, our main supplier as well as other suppliers are having difficulty obtaining the equipment we need, some suppliers saying they won't have the equipment until April 2022. We have the manpower and are ready to begin work, we simply cannot acquire the equipment. If this is the case, we will be unable to meet the March 1st incentive change deadline for these projects. The 4 clients are now considering canceling their participation in the program and retaining their fuel burning equipment, since we cannot keep the promise of the current incentives. This is completely out of our control.

The program should allow contractors to submit already signed contracts to the program, along with a letter from the supplier detailing why we cannot obtain the equipment in time for March 1st, thus locking/grandfathering us in to the pre-March 1st incentives.
