Re: Program Changes

The NYS Clean Heat Program is reaching out to announce program changes for implementation on September 1, 2022. Under current practice, the Clean Heat Joint Management Committee (JMC) announces major program changes on June 1 and December 1 of each year, with these changes to take effect on September 1 and March 1 of each year, respectively.

The program changes being announced today will become effective **September 1, 2022** and are listed below. For incentive level changes, please refer to the table of changes included in Attachment A, which is also available on NYSERDA's website at <a href="https://saveenergy.ny.gov/NYScleanheat/resources/">https://saveenergy.ny.gov/NYScleanheat/resources/</a> and attached here.

### • Heat Pump Water Heater Midstream Incentive

o All utilities will be adding a midstream distributor incentive for HPWHs.

### • Incentives for Decommissioning and Integrated Controls

- All utilities in the state will offer incentives for decommissioning and integrated controls for full load residential systems as of September 1, 2022.
- National Grid and NYSEG/RG&E will be adding incentives for Category 2A Integrated Controls and Category 2B - Decommissioning.
- Central Hudson will be adding an incentive for Category 2A Integrated Controls.

#### • Kicker for Gas-Constrained Areas

National Grid will be adding a kicker incentive for gas-constrained areas.

### Incentive Limitations

- o For all projects, incentives will be limited to 70% of project costs.
- A \$1 million "soft" cap for incentives will be specified in the Program Manual. For projects that request incentives above \$1 million, the utility reserves the right to limit incentives to \$1 million or offer incentives at a custom rate.
- Ground source projects in residential Category 3 will be offered incentives up to \$50,000.

### Preliminary Incentive Offer Letter (PIOL)

 Utilities will be including a default incentive expiration date in the PIOL for nonresidential projects. An applicant may request the utility's approval for an extension and adjustments may be made on a case-by-case basis.

### • Non-residential refinements

 Utilities may adjust incentive levels to differentiate projects in new construction versus existing buildings with specific incentive levels by heat pump technology.

Stakeholders are invited to attend meetings of the Participating Contractors and Industry Partners Working Group Series to hear more about these program changes. The next meeting will be held on **Thursday, June 9**. Details can be found on the NYS Clean Heat website under Working Group Series.

As previously announced, the Con Edison Clean Heat Program remains in a pause and is not accepting applications for air source heat pump incentives at this time. Con Edison will update the market when it is ready to resume offering incentives for air source heat pumps.

The JMC extends its thanks to the manufacturer, contractor, and stakeholder community for all of the input and dialogue that continues to shape the program. We look forward to further collaboration and engagement as the program continues to evolve.
